 - b. 2 Background Statements (May be Found in the "Writing Situation" of the Prompt)
 - c. Thesis Statement (Controlling Idea of Essay)
 - i. "There are a number of...."
 - ii. "There are many..."
- II. Body Paragraphs (There should be 3 body paragraphs)(Follow the outline below for each body paragraph) DRAPES Does not have to be in order in each paragraph. You do not have to each element in each paragraph.)
 - a. Transition
 - b. Topic Sentence
 - c. DIALOGUE
 - d. RHETORICAL QUESTION
 - e. ANALOGY
 - f. PERSONAL EXPERIENCE
 - g. EXAMPLE
 - h. STATISTIC
