## Essay

On December 22, 2018, a tsunami rocked the Sunda Strait in Indonesia. Caused by an underwater landslide off the coast of Anak Krakatau volcano and resulting in a powerful seismic sea wave, this event was one of the most devastating natural disasters to hit this region in recent years.

The tsunami struck at 9:30 pm local time, generating waves up to 5 meters (16 feet) in height which caused catastrophic damage as far away as 120 kilometers (75 miles). The most affected areas included Lampung on the island of Sumatra and the islands of Banten, Java and Carita on the west coast of Java.

The specific cause of the Sunda Strait tsunami was the collapse of a major portion of Anak Krakatau volcano that had been continuously active since June 2018. This collapse resulted in a powerful underwater landslide which triggered an earthquake measuring 4.4 on the Richter scale, creating an enormous wave that crashed into coastal communities and nearby islands.

The effects of the Sunda Strait tsunami were catastrophic. In addition to the sweeping destruction of homes and infrastructure, over 437 people lost their lives in this disaster. Over 14,000 people were left homeless and many more remain displaced due to the extensive damage caused by the wave.
